1	Christian McCaffrey, CAR	RB	1	A healthy CMC provides the greatest edge in FF, and numbers suggest it's not close. All RBs carry risk.
2	Jonathan Taylor, IND	RB	2	Coach has hinted at scaled-back workload. Still a safe, elite option at premium position.
3	Austin Ekeler, LAC	RB	3	Checks all boxes: Efficient. Productive. Catches. Red zone. Great offense (QB + O-Line). No clearcut RB2.
4	Justin Jefferson, MIN	WR	1	Preparing for take-off in 3rd year under Vikings' new pass-first approach. My bet to lead NFL in catches.
5	Ja'Marr Chase, CIN	WR	2	Expecting CIN to pass more this season. Chase could be this generation's Randy Moss.
6	Cooper Kupp, LAR	WR	3	2021 Fantasy MVP will continue dominance if he and his QB stay healthy. I worry about the latter.
7	Derrick Henry, TEN	RB	4	Top-scoring PPR back in his 9 games. Titans declining, but projected workload keeps him a 1st Rd value.
8	Dalvin Cook, MIN	RB	5	Due positive TD regression. Must insure him by drafting Mattison later. Combo should yield Top-10 RB.
9	Joe Mixon, CIN	RB	6	Career year in '21. Would like him to play more on 3rd down, but explosive offense w/ improved O-Line.
10	Travis Kelce, KC	TE	1	Tyreek gone; could be a huge difference maker in PPR formats at a scarce position. Top-2 TE 5 straight szns.

QB: Unless you play in a Super Flex league, there is no reason to select a QB in Rounds 1-2.

RB: Try to draft at least 1 RB in first 2 rounds. This year the Rd. 2 RBs are strong. Often taking a RB in Rd. 2, especially if I drafted a WR in Rd. 1.

WR: Avoid starting WR-WR because plenty of quality WRs will be available later.

TE: I feel more comfortable drafting Kelce in Rd. 2 if I opened with an RB in Rd. 1 and I'm in a full-PPR league.

11	Saquon Barkley, NYG	RB	7	Predictably flopped last year coming off ACL. Predicting MAJOR bounceback as centerpiece under better coaching.
12	Aaron Jones, GB	RB	8	Great fantasy skillset (catches passes & TD scorer). Sans Adams, GB offense should revolve around Jones and Dillon.
13	Javonte Williams, DEN	RB	9	An RB2 as a rookie in a 50-50 split w/ Gordon & w/ Bridgewater at QB. Betting on JW>MG. Russ Wilson boosts upside.
14	Najee Harris, PIT	RB	10	400+ touches last szn. Many catches due to Big Ben's dead arm. Different QBs, 3 quality WRs, good TE. Subpar O-Line.
15	D'Andre Swift, DET	RB	11	Popular breakout, but ceiling exists: Williams will siphon work. Offense led by Goff. Added pass catching competition.
16	Stefon Diggs, BUF	WR	4	Still a safe selection for PPR production despite down year in 2021 compared to 2020 explosion.
17	Mike Evans, TB	WR	5	Checks all boxes: Proven talent. Annual production. Great QB. 15+ TD upside w/ Gronk, AB retired and Godwin out.
18	Leonard Fournette, TB	RB	12	Top-3 RB in CGS last season (ahead of JT!)! But O-Line, offense worsened. Rachaad White a recommended handcuff.
19	Alvin Kamara, NO	RB	13	May avoid suspension in '22. Great skillset but unlikely to reach prime heights w/o Brees, more target comp at WR.
20	Davante Adams, LVR	WR	6	QB downgrade and increase in target competition (Waller + Renfrow).

QB: I'm still not really considering the QB position at this point.

RB: Kamara and Fournette are tough to pass in late Rd.-2, particularly if I only have 1 RB or fewer through 2 Rds.

WR: I'm ending up with a lot of Mike Evans, Michael Pittman, and Tee Higgins in Rd. 3, especially when I open up RB-RB.

TE: Kelce in Rd. 3 is virtually an auto-select. I'm not quite as high on Andrews, but I'll go that route if I'm comfortable with my RBs.

21	CeeDee Lamb, DAL	WR7	Awful second half of 2021 overshadowed by immense opportunity as target hog; Dak has no other WRs.
22	Michael Pittman Jr., IND	WR8	Breakout incoming with QB upgrade, lack of pass catching competition.
23	Mark Andrews, BAL	TE2	Oddly averaged 14.86 PPG in 11 games w/ Lamar Jackson last season vs. 22.88 PPG in 6 games w/ backup QBs.
24	Tee Higgins, CIN	WR9	Underrated talent. Posted similar totals to Chase last season, who will draw defensive attention away from Higgins.
25	James Conner, ARI	RB14	Career year for fragile RB resulting in payday spells risk. Nevertheless, 26.1 PPG (RB1 Pace) in 6 games w/o Edmonds.
26	Kyle Pitts, ATL	TE3	1000+ REYD as a rookie TE but only 1 TD. Unlucky. Expect sizable sophomore leap for possible generational talent.
27	DJ Moore, CAR	WR10	Not a TD scorer, but a YAC monster in his prime with his best QB to-date. No target comp outside of CMC.
28	Deebo Samuel, SF	WR11	Amazing player, could make this ranking look dumb, but new QB, low-volume pass offense w/ Aiyuk and Kittle there.
29	Tyreek Hill, MIA	WR12	Obvious QB downgrade from Mahomes to Tua. But should draw 140+ targets, lay-up catches for PPR
30	Josh Allen, BUF	QB1	Going for 3-peat of QB1. Outscored QB2 in '21 CGS by 3 PPG. Rushing, downfield aggression, pass-first O, & talented wear

QB: I'll stop a Josh Allen slide under the right circumstances. Otherwise, I'm still not really considering the QB position at this point.

RB: Zeke often falls to Rd. 4, which is solid if I have 1 RB or fewer at this point.

WR: Rds. 4-6 = the sweet spot for WRs, and my board reflects this. Try to draft at least 2 within those 3 rounds.

TE: Rd. 4 is Kyle Pitts territory for me.

32	Nick Chubb, CLE	RB16	Suboptimal situation with Brissett at QB for 11+ games for gamescript-dependent RB. High floor, low ceiling.
33	Courtland Sutton, DEN	WR13	Excusing last year coming off the ACL. Betting on a major recovery as Russ Wilson's top target.
34	Gabriel Davis, BUF	WR14	Bold rank based on '21 finish, red zone success, downfield/big-play threat for great QB in pass-happy O. My go-to guy Rds
35	A.J. Brown, PHI	WR15	Can Hurts support a Top-12 WR, along with Smith and Goedert, in a very run-based offense? I'm skeptical.
36	Mike Williams, LAC	WR16	In prime and has great QB who suits Williams' skillset. May be boom-or-bust weekly, but can win weeks.
37	Keenan Allen, LAC	WR17	Seems like Allen on the decline as Williams ascends. Safe pick, stronger for full-PPR formats.
38	Allen Robinson II., LAR	WR18	Already questions about Stafford's elbow, but otherwise believe A-Rob will rebound in big way. Top-12 upside.
39	Amon-Ra St. Brown, DET	WR19	League-winner down the stretch, proved he can ball. More target comp & Goff lowers ceiling, but I'm buying some carry-ov
40	Marquise Brown, ARI	WR20	Top-8 WR in PPG in first 8 games before BAL offense imploded. Has played w/ Kyler. Hopkins suspended 6 gms. Speed kills

QB: Prefer WRs in this range, but I'll take a Top-6 QB if I have 3 WRs and 2 RBs already. Not forcing it though, bc I like the next tier of QBs as well.

RB: If I need an RB2 or RB3, I'm preparing to strike on Chase Edmonds between Rds. 5-7.

WR: Mostly hammering WRs in Rds. 4-7. My most commonly drafted WRs here have been Sutton, Gabe Davis, St. Brown, and Brown. I love Davis this yr.

TE: I'd prefer WRs in this range.

41	Jaylen Waddle, MIA	WR21	Extremely impressive rookie season. Will move up when he returns to practice. Do we KNOW Hill will outproduce Waddle?
42	Chase Edmonds, MIA	RB17	Mispriced in ADP/rankings: far too low. Efficient runner/receiver will be lead back in run-first O. RBs behind him are brittle.
43	Cam Akers	RB18	Evidence shows Rams want him as lead back. Can he regain explosiveness after torn Achilles? 3rd Rd. too steep to find out.
44	Rashod Bateman, BAL	WR22	Popular breakout candidate among experts. I agree. Ravens must agree too bc they've neglected WR position behind him.
45	A.J. Dillon, GB	RB19	Offense revolves around RBs. Dillon scores TDs & can catch. Stand-alone value hit-or-miss, but league-winner if Jones hurt
46	Justin Herbert, LAC	QB2	QB3 in '21 CGS. Ascending player surrounded w/ quality weapons, O-Line, aggressive coach. NFL MVP may be in future.
47	Lamar Jackson, BAL	QB3	QB4 in '21 CGS (11 full games), including QB2 Pace through 8 gms. Has bulked up. BAL bolstered O-Line.
48	Patrick Mahomes, KC	QB4	QB2 in '21 CGS. Finished strongly (QB1 Pace in final 8 gms, inc. playoffs) after big midseason slump. But lost star WR Hill.
49	Kyler Murray, ARI	QB5	2nd straight szn w/ hot start (QB2 Pace through 9 gms) before injury crippled 2nd half. Added Brown but Hopkins out 6 g
50	Jalen Hurts, PHI	QB6	QB6 in '21 CGS. QB2 Pace through 7 gms, but finished QB16 Pace in final 9. PHI became run-first, started winning. Added /

QB: I'm reading the draft room to see how many QBs have been taken. Ideally, I want to be the 8th-11th team to draft my QB.

RB: If I need a RB2, I'm willing to reach for Edmonds in Rd. 5, and regardless of circumstances, I'm not letting him pass Rd. 7.

WR: I'm still likely working my WRs here. Specifically, I want Gabe Davis on all my teams.

TE: After Pitts is selected, I'm not really investing in any TE until Rd. 6 or later. I'd prefer Schultz over Kittle and Waller, and Schultz later.

Rds. 6-7

51	Dalton Schultz, DAL	TE4	TE7 in '21 CGS, but that was mostly w/ Gallup/Cooper. DAL now has nothing behind Lamb/Schultz. Dak can easily support.
52	George Kittle, SF	TE5	Will have splash gms, but only TE8 in '21 CGS. Low pass-volume O expected w/ new QB, competing w/ Aiyuk & Deebo.
53	Devin Singletary, BUF	RB20	Cook will take receiving work, but Singletary was a league-winner down the stretch w/ little pass game work. Piece of great O.
54	Travis Etienne, JAX	RB21	Popular breakout, but overpriced IMO. HC Pederson prefers RBBCs. If J-Rob able to start szn, this is RBBC on bad O / team.
55	Josh Jacobs, LVR	RB22	Indications seem like RBBC w/ new HC McDaniels. Jacobs has improved as receiver though, should get goal line.
56	Clyde Edwards-Helaire, KC	RB23	Lead back of Mahomes-led O. Battled injuries last year (and as rookie). Make or break year. KC let Williams/RoJo walk.
57	Terry McLaurin, WAS	WR23	How much is Wentz an upgrade? TM drafted Dotson Rd. 1, gets Samuel back healthy. McLaurin not a TD scorer.
58	Brandin Cooks, HOU	WR24	Impressed last szn. Probably should have him higher based on numbers, but gut tells me he won't do it twice.
59	Joe Burrow, CIN	QB7	If HC Taylor lets Burrow loose (last szn he was coming off ACL w/ bad O-Line), he could match Mahomes. O-Line fixed.
60	Trey Lance, SF	QB8	Unproven but attractive fantasy skillset. Big arm & rushing prowess. Outstanding scheme and weapons. O-Line concerns.

QB: I'll reach for Lance in sharp leagues. If I miss out, I'm cool with Burrow, Russ, or Dak. I may wait to see who falls in this tier.

RB: Rd. 6 is where I've been drafting Edmonds constantly. Otherwise, I've been able to land RBs like Dillon, Singletary, CEH in Rds. 7-8.

WR: If any of the WRs mentioned above fall to Rd. 7 (often times, it's Bateman), I'll draft them unless Edmonds is there.

TE: Rds 6-7 are a spot I'll strongly consider Schultz if I feel confident in my skill positions (RB-WR). Schultz is more attractive in PPR formats.

62	Dak Prescott, DAL	QB10	QB5 Pace before calf injury (6 gms). 1 year removed from brutal leg injury= more rushing. O-Line & weapons concerning.
63	Dallas Goedert, PHI	TE6	Had several close-calls or TDs negated by penalty. Question if Hurts can support AJB, Smith & Goedert in run-first O.
64	Darren Waller, LVR	TE7	Will move him up when he returns to practice. Sketchy August. Also only TE5 in '21 CGS, w/o Adams.
65	T.J. Hockenson, DET	TE8	TE6 in '21 CGS. Increase in target competition: ARSB, Swift, Chark, Williams for some. All to be supported by Goff?
66	David Montgomery, CHI	RB24	Love the player, hate the situation. CHI may compete for 1st overall pick. Horrific O-Line. New staff may prefer RBBC.

69	Rashaad Penny, SEA	RB27	Finally got healthy and showed out as league-winner late. Doubt Walker eats into role early. Issues: trash team & no receivin
70	Miles Sanders, PHI	RB28	Efficient runner has struggled in pass game. PHI uses Hurts at goal line, Gainwell on pass downs. Expecting many 15-90-0 g

QB: I'm usually the 8th-11th team to draft a QB. If Lance/Burrow are taken, I may wait a round or two to see who falls among that QB tier.

RB: Once I have 3 WRs and either a QB or a TE, I'll take 1-2 of the RBs below.

WR: If I'm comfortable with my RBs and need a 3rd or 4th WR, I'll see if Lazard or Mooney are available in Rd 8+.

TE: If I miss out on Schultz and don't have a TE yet, it's possible Goedert or Hockenson fall to Rd. 8+. I'll scoop either up if the value is right.

71	J.K. Dobbins, BAL	RB29	Love the sitch, and he's shown talent. Low ranking is all about health. Historically, RBs are bad bets in year 1 after ACL tears
72	Allen Lazard, GB	WR25	Finished strongly. Odds are Rodgers will make one of his WRs a strong fantasy option. He's talked up Lazard as the No. 1 of
73	Darnell Mooney, CHI	WR26	Former Tulane alumnus seems to be Fields' guy. Mooney is a big play threat who could see great volume in bad offense.

QB: If my league is QB-happy and my Top-10 QBs are taken before I'm ready, I need to end up with a QB in the my next tier below.

RB: If I take a RB between Rds. 9-10 or Picks 90-110'ish, it's usually Pierce or Stevenson who are available.

WR: Aiyuk, MVS, and Pickens are popular picks in this range for me.

TE: If I don't have a TE, I'll wait to be one of the last teams to draft one, targeting 1 of Freiermuth, Kmet, or Knox around TE12, between Rds. 9-11.

81	Tom Brady, TB	QB11	Annually outproduces projections. Last year (QB5 in CGS) seems like best-case. QB12 Pace in final 11 gms. Worse support
82	Kirk Cousins, MIN	QB12	QB12 in '21 CGS. Expectation is offense will throw more. No defense, playing indoors, and playing DET/CHI x2 /yr raises flo
83	Aaron Rodgers, GB	QB13	Believe GB will win w/ running game, defense, but you better believe Rodgers scores 30+ TDs. NFC North (DET/MIN/CHI) x2
84	Derek Carr, LVR	QB14	QB21 in '21 CGS (inc. QB16 Pace in 11 gms w/ Waller), so he needs to take a big leap w/ Adams. AFCW shootouts may help
85	Matthew Stafford, LAR	QB15	QB8 in '21 CGS. Worried about the elbow wearing down as season progresses. No rushing floor.

94	Cole Kmet, CHI	TE10	Rankings/ADP suppressed due to 0 TDs. I believe he'll breakout as Fields' No. 2 target. CHI will be in catch-up mode often.
95	Adam Thielen, MIN	WR36	Elite TD scorer aging slowly but surely. In position to outperform ADP early again, but will he be difference maker late?
96	Drake London, ATL	WR37	Positives: just he and Pitts, ATL has no defense, plays indoors. But can Mariota support great szns for both? Will Ridder pl

Rds. 10-17 (Picks 110+)

QB: There is no need to draft a backup/bench QB in 10/12-team leagues that start 1 QB, I usually finish my drafts with 1 QB in total.

RB: Between picks 100-140'ish, I'm trying to draft 2-3 RBs below. Often Hines, Mattison, White, & Robinson. I usually finish drafts with 5-6 RBs.

WR: Pickens, Meyers, and/or Doubs are targets after pick 110'ish. I'll take 1-2 more WRs late (picks 140+). I usually finish drafts with 6 WRs.

TE: If I punted the position, I'm OK with pairing 2 of Freiermuth, Kmet, & Knox, if one falls far. However, I usually finish drafts with 1 TE in total.

Defenses & Kickers

(Draft 1 of each in the final 4 rounds)

- K:** If it's Rd. 13 or later of a 16-round draft and I feel strongly about my squad, I'll take 1 of my top-rated kickers: Tucker or McPherson.
If they are taken before me, no sweat; I'll target McManus or Bass in the second-to-last round. If they are taken, I'll draft Lutz in the final round.
- DST:** If it's Rd. 13 or later of a 16-round draft and I feel strongly about my squad, I'll take 1 of my top-rated defenses: Packers or Saints.
