#### <u>KEY</u>:

Player's rank on this platform is lower than my ranking. Therefore, I am more likely to target and draft this player on this particular platform. Player's rank on this platform is fairly in line with my ranking, so I'm neutral toward this player on this platform. I'll draft in the right circumstance. Player's rank on this platform is higher than my ranking. Therefore, it's unlikely that I'm drafting this player on this platform unless he slides.

**EXAMPLE**: I am more likely to draft RB Nick Chubb (#7) in ESPN leagues because his ranking on ESPN is 18th overall,

as opposed to Yahoo! leagues, where his ranking on that platform (7th overall) is more in line with my ranking of Chubb.

**APPLICATION**: If I have pick 10/12 in an ESPN league, it's possible that I can draft Stefon Diggs (#8) before Chubb (#7) and get both players, in order to maximize value on my Draft Board.

**WORKING THE BOARD**: Deviations from the FLG Draft Board may be prudent depending on positions drafted, stacking, scoring/format, etc. **ROSTER CONSTRUCTION**: Rule of thumb = Draft 1 QB, 4 RBs, 4 WRs, and 1 TE by Rd. 11 (in no specific order; try not to triple one position early **NOTES**: Rankings assume default roster and scoring settings on ESPN & Yahoo! (PPR/half PPR). *Board will be UPDATED REGULARLY until kickoff.*
