Player's rank on this platform is lower than my ranking. Therefore, I am more likely to target and draft this player on this particular platform.

Player's rank on this platform is higher than my ranking. Therefore, it's unlikely that I'm drafting this player on this platform unless he slides.

Player's rank on this platform is fairly in line with my ranking, so I'm neutral toward this player on this platform. I'll draft in the right circumstance.

EXAMPLE: I am more likely to draft WR Drake London (#22) in ESPN leagues because his ADP on ESPN is 32nd overall, as opposed to Yahoo! leagues, where London's ADP on that platform (22nd overall) is right in line with my ranking.

APPLICATION: Rather than strictly adhering to the ranks on this Draft Board, use it as a guideline. For instance, you can maximize value in your draft by selecting Patrick Mahomes (#27) ahead of Jaylen Waddle (#23) knowing that Waddle's ADP is much later, allowing you to draft both!

WORKING THE BOARD: Deviations from the FLG Draft Board may be prudent depending on positions drafted, stacking, scoring/format, etc.

ROSTER CONSTRUCTION: First 10 Rds.: Draft 1 QB, 4 RBs, 4 WRs, and 1 TE (any order, but no QB/TE in first 3 rds.; do not to triple one position).

NOTES: Rankings assume default roster and scoring settings on ESPN & Yahoo! (PPR/half PPR).

TIPS: Stacking a QB-WR or QB-TE combination on the same team is preferable when possible. Any tie-breakers go to better offense.

UPDATES: Board will be UPDATED REGULARLY until kickoff.

Everything sets up nicely for once-in-decade prospect. Moore/Allen/Odunze/Swift. Run ability. Slight concern about OC Waldron.

81 **Zack Moss, CIN** **RB24** **101** **91**

My bet to be Bengals' primary runner, goal line back. This provides 10 TD upside. Can he hold off Chase Brown in pass game?

82 **Devin Singletary, NYG** **RB25** **110** **114**

Like it or not, Giants signed him to do it all, play Barkley role. Will be ugly at times, but Singletary familiar w/ Daboll offense (BUF)

83 **Zamir White, LVR** **RB28** **67** **70**

Raiders want White (bulked up) getting 20 carries a game. Doubtful gamescript allows. Finished strongly. Minimal receptions.

84 **D'Andre Swift, CHI** **RB29** **63** **78**
